I 50th Anniversary of the wreck of the Admella: Commemoration Event Date

"Commemorating a Tragedy; Celebrating Volunteerism"

Thursday 6th August - Sunday 16th August 2009 has been chosen as the date of the Commemoration Event.

These dates help "mirror" events as they happened in 1859: the Admella was wrecked on 6th August 1859; the survivors rescued on Thursday 13th August 1859 after which they were taken by ship to Portland to recover.

In an endeavour to allow visitors to view other areas of the region during the Commemoration Event, townships have been allocated certain days for major events:

Events are being planned in consultation

with the District Council of Grant, Glenelg Shire, Wattle Range Council and City of Mount Gambier to ensure major events do not clash and to provide a variety of events suitable for people of different ages & interests.

A number of events are in the planning stage, including many community organised events. It is envisaged the event program will be launched before the end of 2008; a sneak preview of what to expect is printed overleaf.

Admella Trail

The Admella Committee is planning the *Admella Trail*, which aims to Commemorate the Wreck of the Admella and promote public awareness of the significance of the event.

The Admella Trail will be a tourist self drive trail with the majority of markers accessible by front wheel drive vehicles. It will also encompass 4 wheel drive tracks and walking trails.

Portland, Cape Bridgewater, Mount Gambier, Cape Banks, Carpenter Rocks, Port MacDonnell, Robe, Beachport, Millicent and Canunda National Park will be included in the trail.

The drive between Cape Banks and Cape Northumber-

land will represent the Sailors Trek, Cape Northumberland and Mount Gambier - the Spread the News trail, Mt Gambier and Cape Banks the Rescuers path.

Markers will resemble mooring posts representing the Maritime theme of the trail, and signage at each site will each tell a different component of the Admella tale. Brochures will be available from local tourism centres, and on -line as a downloadable PDF file.

Grant funding and corporate sponsorship for this project is currently being sought. Markers may also be donated by descendants in memory of their Admella ancestor. The Admella Committee has applied to the Australian Tax Office for Deductible Gift Recipient Status and will create sponsorship packages when this comes through.

Other Commemoration Projects

Model Ship: A project brief was distributed, and a submission by Adrian Brewer of Float a Boat (Melbourne) was chosen as the preferred tender. The model will be about 1metre in length, in a timber framed display case and will cost approx \$6,000, The model would be housed at the Port MacDonnell & District Maritime Museum, but will be compact enough to tour schools and community events to promote the Admella Commemorations.

We currently have grant applications pending with the Department of the Environment and Water Resources - Commemoration of Historic Events and Famous Persons Program and the History Trust of SA – SA History Fund.

School's Resource Kit: To ensure the next generation of Australians remember the Admella, a Schools' Resource Kit is being created. The kit should include multi-media vignettes, interactive game and teacher resources.

A number of regional & retired school teachers are producing a body of work about the Admella, with some of the work trialled at Allendale Area School already. We also hope to work with the National Museum of Australia to produce a body of work for school children Australia wide.

To complete the Admella experience, local camp grounds and hostels will be promoted to schools to encourage school camps and visits to the region.

Historic links

Capt Emmanuel Underwood was commissioned by Governor Grey in 1845 to survey the South Coast for a port. Capt Underwood was master of the Admella on at least one trip from Melbourne to Adelaide prior to the wreck. His son **Edward Underwood** perished on board the ill fated Admella. Correspondence about the wreck between Edward's family have been donated to the SA State Archives by descendants of Captain Underwood, who have registered with the Committee.

The first navigational aid on the **South East Coast** was the obelisk at Cape Dombey, Robe in 1855. The **McDonnell Light at Cape Northumberland** was opened on 1 January 1859. This was the first light on

the Australian coastline to be seen by vessels completing their Great Circle Route from England. A total of 30 vessels were wrecked between 1835 and 1865 on the South East Coast.

The **Dunbar**, which featured with the Admella in this year's Historic Shipwrecks series of Australia Post Stamps, was wrecked in Aug 1857 at South Head as she come into Port Jackson (Sydney Harbor). Of the 121 people on board only crewman James Johnson was rescued after he clung to a cliff face for 36 hours. Interestingly enough the 2nd mate on board the Admella when it was wrecked two years to the month later was **J. Johnson**. Could it possibly be the same seaman?

The Southern Coast was not a good one for **Captain Hugh McEwan**, master of the Admella, he also owned the iron barque Glenrosa which was wrecked in 1890 not far from where the Admella met her end.

The **Carpenters Reef** which runs along the coastline near Cape Banks, and is the reef the Admella was wrecked on, was originally named "les Charpentiers" by the French explorer Nicholas Baudin who mapped the area in 1802.

The Colony of SA had established five south east ports by 1878; Greytown (Southend) 1845, Robe 1847, Kingston 1848, Port McDonnell 1860, and Beachport 1878.

George Ward: Admella Cabin boy

George Ward

George Ernest Ward (b1840 d1919) arrived in South Australia in 1856 and was 19 when he worked on board the Admella as a cabin boy. He survived the wreck and shortly after moved to Kameruka, near Bega NSW, where he worked as a stockman, dairyman and then became one of the managers of the Estate, where he lived and worked for 50 years.

From his humble beginnings as a carpet weaver's assistant at age 11, he become president of the Jockey Club, Guardian of Minors, Justice of the Peace, Commissioner for Affidavits, and Chairman of the Recruiting Committee and the Voluntary Aid League. He married Mary Ann Selina Butler in 1863 and they had 12 children; one was named Admella.

George's granddaughter, great grandson & great grandchildren, and descendants of George's brother John & sister Anne have registered with the Committee.

Relief & Reward Fund

The Admella Relief and Reward Fund "at the desire of the Inhabitants of Victoria" used funds raised by public subscription as an aftermath to the Admella wreck to build the Melbourne Sailor's Home . The Sailor's Home was demolished to replan the area near the Spencer Street Bridge in the 1960's and a marble tablet which commemorates the rescue efforts of volunteers was salvaged and will be restored by the Glenelg Shire.



James and Ann Ledwith were married in 1830 in Ireland and immigrated to SA on 1/10/1840. They had 10 children:
